Relief: Hopital de la Communaute Haitienne - was founded 40 years ago to give quality medical service to the indigent population of Haiti turning none away. This 50-bed hospital facility has a full functioning ICU and maternity ward. Any donation has a hands-on 100% positive affect on the Haitian people who are most vulnerable from the earthquake. Grace Network's mission to Haiti began 20 years ago with a committed relationship between one of its churches, Raccoon Ford Christian Fellowship in Culpeper, VA, to a single church, L'Eglise Baptiste D'Siloe. Because of that long-term relationship, help to Haitians after the devastating earthquake has a ready channel and an infrastructure. Grace Network is prepared to help this community of believers and its gospel outreach long into the future. This mission is all about personal relationship that joins forces to respond to the work God is already doing there.

That vision, which began with modest medical help, has grown to include not only medical teams but also help with construction, medical training, and support for the church's leadership.

Siloe has suffered like all of Haiti. Pastor Bienne and many members of the church community were killed. The first Grace medical team has just returned to VA and additional teams will head in each month, beginning in March. All help is administered under the auspices of Siloe's leadership allowing the church to best meet the needs of its community and helping the members look to their leaders, not Americans, for direction.

There are two ways to help this ministry. One is to donate to the Grace Network Haiti Fund where 100% of the contributions go to help Siloe. Another is to contribute to the cost of sending the teams to Haiti. For more information, please contact Cyndy.

On behalf of the ministries we are working with in Haiti, thank you for your generosity in prayer and financial support for relief work in that nation. So far we have received over \$180,000 into our Disaster Relief fund, with \$70,000 already distributed to our friends in ministry who are on the ground doing relief work:

- \$25,000 to churches in the Dominican Republic who are operating medical clinics in Haiti
- \$25,000 to ministries serving churches and orphanages in Haiti
- \$20,000 to trusted relief organizations

According to our contacts in Haiti, the most pressing needs there are still for food, medicine, and safe shelter. To that end, prayer and financial support remain the primary ways that your church can serve them. We have asked about sending in both supplies and teams of volunteers, but for the time being both of those options are less strategic than simply sending funds to meet immediate needs and provide for future rebuilding efforts.
